OECD FORUM 2015 WILL TAKE PLACE ON 2 AND 3 JUNE IN PARIS

PARTICIPANTS FROM 70 COUNTRIES

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USPA NEWS - Held in Paris every year to coincide with the main annual OECD Ministerial, the Forum is a key moment for discussion on the major issues on the international agenda. "Forum 2015 will be organized around 5 themes. The principal focus will be around COP 21 to be held in November in Paris.

THE 5 THEMES TO BE DISCUSSED AT THE FORUM-----

The 5 themes this year are as follows, with particular focus to climate change in preamble of the preparation of COP 21.-----

1-Unlocking Investment

2-Addressing Inequality

3-Innovation

4-The Transition to the Low Carbon Economy

5-Sustainable Development Goals

They will be represented by Philippe Benoit, Head of Energy Efficiency and Environment, Richard Baron, coordinator for "Align policies for a low carbon economy", OECD, and Simon Buckle, Head of Climate Change Division, biodiversity and water at OECD to discuss COP21 and have preview a new report analyzing the extent to which policy measures - be they related to land use, trade or investment - hampering efforts to fight against climate change.
